Private Sponsorship for Refugees (PSR) for Syrians and Iraqis - Program Status

You are receiving this email because your name has been added to our wait list for this refugee/immigration program for Syrians and Iraqis. If you don't wish to receive future updates or no longer wish to remain on the wait list, please click on unsubscribe below.

We will be sending this update on a monthly or as needed basis to inform you of any changes in the program throughout the year. Please ensure you add the domains explorecanadaimmigration.ca and mailchimp.com to your safe domains list in your browser to avoid sending our communications to your junk mail folder.

Now for the update. As you know, due to a key decision by the current Canadian government on December 19, 2016 – the Private Sponsorship for Refugees (PSR) for Syrians and Iraqis has been

limited again and exemptions have been removed once a quota of 1000 applicants has been received from Community Sponsors and Group of Five in 2017, and this quota was reached on January 18, 2017. Going forward, Immigration, Refugee and Citizenship Canada (IRCC) is only accepting refugee applications from Syrian and Iraqi citizens living outside of Syria and Iraq, respectively, through Sponsorship Agreement Holders (SAH) without a UNHCR referral, or through Community Sponsors and Group of Five (G5) with a UNHCR referral. In addition, the maximum applications which will be accepted for the remainder of 2017 has been capped to 7,500 applications in total. This represents a significant setback from the levels accepted in 2016 and is a direct result of the overwhelmed refugee/immigration processing centers and visa offices. This new temporary public policy forms part of a broader strategy to address and alleviate the large backlog and long wait times in the Privately Sponsored Refugees (PSR) category.

As of April 4, 2017, we have become aware that the government has released only a small allocation of the 7,500 applications to authorized SAHs, and these have been used to help Syrians with the most severe situations and cases mostly in refugee camps and in neighboring countries to Syria. Please note that you will be able to expedite your application, if you register with the UNHCR and obtain a Convention Refugee referral. You will be most likely able to do this from Lebanon or Jordan currently. If you do obtain this document, please contact me to start your application immediately.

In the meantime, we continue to discuss the situation with our SAHs and monitor the distribution of additional allocations by IRCC. We will continue to update you on this situation throughout the year and until the 7,500 applications have been completely received by IRCC and the program is rendered closed for this year.

If you would like to explore other program options in the meantime, please complete and send us the immigration assessment that you initially received from us or otherwise can be found on our website here: http://www.explorecanadaimmigration.ca/Immigration_Assessment.docx.

Other program options include but not limited to:

- Federal and Provincial Skilled Worker Programs – English/French language equivalency tests required with a minimum CLB score. A job offer is not required.
- Investor and Entrepreneur Programs – minimum net worth required is \$350,000 CAD of which \$250,000 needs to be in cash.
- International Graduate Program – for post-graduate students willing to study further and work in Canada.

Now as for already submitted PSR applications, this latest government decision has no effect on them. In fact, the decision is expected to help to expedite processing for these applications. As of today, applications submitted in 2016 are still expected to take 1 year and 3 months to process from the date the application was submitted, as there seems to be a 3 months delay so far this year. IRCC is addressing the delay problems by implementing improvements in processing centres and visa offices abroad.

Moreover, we would like to inform all of those who have obtained an application/file number from IRCC since December 2016, if you are unable to view your application status on the IRCC's web portal to date, then please note that because of the large number of file numbers issued all simultaneously, IRCC is taking more time to upload your information to the portal. Please be patient and keep checking the portal and take note that this delay doesn't affect your application processing in any way.

أما فيما يخص اطلاعكم على آخر الاخبار، فكما تعلمون ان الحكومة الكندية الحالية قد قامت باتخاذ قرار هام جداً بتاريخ 2016/12/19 بشأن برنامج كفالة اللاجئين الخاصة والمتعلق بالجنسيات السورية والعراقية والذي أصبح محدوداً جداً مرة أخرى ويتمثل هذا القرار في شطب الاستثناءات التي تم العمل بها مسبقاً حيث تم استلام الوزارة العدد المحدد لهذا الغرض والبالغ الف طلب متقدم للجوء من قبل فئة "الكفلاء الاجتماعيين" و"مجموعة الخمسة" خلال عام 2017، وقد تم تحقيق هذه النسبة في الثامن عشر من شهر يناير الماضي من هذا العام.

وعليه، تقوم وزارة الهجرة الكندية من الآن فصاعداً فقط بقبول طلبات اللاجئين الخاصة بالسوريين والعراقيين الذين يقيمون خارج سوريا والعراق وذلك عن طريق (SAH) دون الحاجة إلى الاحالة من طرف المفوض السامي التابع لهيئة الامم المتحدة لرعاية اللاجئين، أو من خلال "الكفلاء الاجتماعيين" و "مجموعة الخمسة" بشرط الاحالة من طرف المفوض السامي التابع لهيئة الامم المتحدة لرعاية اللاجئين. وبالإضافة إلى ذلك، فقد تم تحديد العدد الاجمالي الأقصى لطلبات اللاجئين والذي سيتم قبوله خلال هذا العام الحالي (2017) ليبلغ 7,500 فقط، وهذا العدد يمثل تراجع

واضح اذا ما قورن بالمستويات التي تم قبولها في العام الماضي (2016) وهي نتيجة مباشرة لما يعكس عليه الوضع الحالي فيما يخص العدد الكبير لطلبات اللاجئين التي تعمل على استكمالها مراكز الهجرة واللاجئين ومكاتب التأشيرات في كافة أنحاء كندا وخارجها. كما ويلاحظ بأن هذه السياسة العامة الجديدة اخذت تشكل جزءاً من استراتيجية أوسع لمعالجة الوضع القائم فيما يخص طلبات الهجرة واللاجئين المكثسة في تلك المراكز والعمل على التخفيف من مشكلة الانتظار لزم طويل فيما يتعلق بفئة طلبات اللاجئين المكفولين من قبل جهات خاصة.

فقد علمنا اعتباراً من اليوم، أي الخامس من ابريل من العام الحالي، بأن الحكومة الكندية قد أعلنت عن تخصيص عدد قليل من طلبات اللاجئين المكفولين المقدمة من قبل (SAH) والبالغ عددها 7,500 طلب فقط بحيث تشمل السوريين الذين هم في أمس الحاجة للجوء ويعيشون أسوأ الظروف الانسانية والقاطنين في مخيمات اللاجئين والدول المجاورة لسوريا. ويرجى العلم بأنه بمقدورنا التعجيل في انجاز طلبكم للجوء ان كنتم مسجلين لدى المفوض السامي التابع لهيئة الامم المتحدة لرعاية اللاجئين وحاصلين على كتاب الاحالة الخاص باللاجئين التابعين للامم المتحدة، علماً بأنه بإمكانكم القيام بذلك حالياً من لبنان أو الاردن. وان تمكنتم من الحصول على هذه الوثيقة، فالرجاء التكرم بالاتصال بنا حتى يتسنى لنا تقديم طلبكم فوراً للجهات الرسمية طرفنا.

وفي غضون ذلك، سنعمل على مواصلة نقاشنا ومراقبتنا للوضع الحالي مع (SAH) بالاضافة الى متابعتنا الحثيثة لاية قرارات قد تخرج بها وزارة الهجرة الكندية فيما يتعلق باية مزيد من طلبات خاصة باللاجئين، كما وسنواصل اطلاعكم على اخر التفاصيل والتطورات الخاصة بهذا الموضوع خلال السنة باكملها ولغاية استكمال استلام (7□500) طلب خاص باللاجئين من قبل وزارة الهجرة الكندية والاعلان عن اغلاق هذا البرنامج لهذا العام.

وان رغبتم في قيامنا بمساعدتكم على دراسة أية خيارات خاصة باية برامج هجرة اخرى، فالرجاء تعبئة النموذج الخاص بالتقييم المبني الذي قمتم باستلامه مسبقاً من طرفنا واعادته الينا، علماً بأنه بإمكانكم الحصول على هذا النموذج من خلال الرابط المتوافر على موقعنا الالكتروني http://www.explorecanadaimmigration.ca/Immigration_Assessment.docx. وتشتمل تلك الخيارات الخاصة بالبرامج الاخرى على سبيل المثال لا الحصر على ما يلي:

- برامج العمال المهرة على المستوى الفيدرالي أو المحلي للمقاطعة: تتطلب هذه البرامج اجتيازكم امتحان اللغة الانجليزية أو الفرنسية على الا يكون ذلك دون المستوى المطلوب حسب النسبة المطلوبة، علماً بأنه ليس شرطاً للقبول في هذا البرنامج الحصول على عرض عمل من كندا.
- برامج رواد الاعمال أو المستثمرين: يتطلب هذا البرنامج بان تمتلك ما قيمته (350,000) دولار كندي من الاصول الصافية بما في ذلك مبلغ وقدره (250,000) دولار كندي نقداً.
- برنامج الدراسات العليا الخاص بالطلاب الدوليين: لقد تم تصميم هذا البرنامج من أجل طلاب برامج الدراسات العليا المهتمين بمتابعة دراساتهم العليا والعمل في كندا.

أما فيما يتعلق بالطلبات الخاصة والمتعلقة باللاجئين السوريين والعراقيين، فإنه لا اثر للقرار الحكومي الاخير عليها. وفي الحقيقة، فإنه من المتوقع ان يساعد هذا القرار على التعجيل في انجاز تلك الطلبات. واعتباراً من اليوم، فإنه ما زال من المتوقع ان يستغرق انجاز الطلبات التي تم تقديمها خلال عام 2016 مدة سنة واحدة وثلاثة شهور وذلك اعتباراً من تاريخ تقديمها وسبب ذلك على ما يبدو بأنه يوجد حتى الان تأخير مدته ثلاثة شهور خلال هذا العام. ومع ذلك، فإن وزارة الهجرة الكندية تعمل حالياً على معالجة مشكلة التأخير هذه وذلك من خلال اجراء تحسينات على مستوى مراكز الانجاز المحلية والخارجية أيضاً.

وعلاوة على ذلك، نود اعلام كل من حصل على رقم ملف/طلب من وزارة الهجرة الكندية منذ شهر ديسمبر من عام 2016 ووجد نفسه بأنه غير قادر على متابعة وضع انجاز طلبه/ملفه عبر الموقع الالكتروني الخاص بوزارة الهجرة الكندية لغاية تاريخه، يرجى العلم بأنه يعود ذلك الى عدد الملفات الكبير والتي تم اصدارها في وقت واحد، مما يتطلب هذا الامر من قبل وزارة الهجرة الكندية وقتاً اضافياً من أجل تحميل المعلومات

الخاصة بكم وتثبيتها في موقعها الالكتروني. وعليه، يرجى التحلي بالصبر والاستمرار في محاولتكم بزيارة الموقع، علماً بان مثل هذا التأخير لن يؤثر سلباً على انجاز طلبكم أو ملفكم بأي حال من الاحوال.

Study shows Canadian immigration system's shift toward migrant workers:

The percentage of temporary foreign workers obtaining permanent residency has increased to 21 per cent from 9 per cent.

March 22, 2017

One out of five foreign workers becomes permanent residents, twice the rate from two decades ago, says a ground-breaking study that examines an immigration system increasingly geared toward temporary migrants.

Only nine per cent of temporary foreign workers who came in the mid-1990s successfully obtained permanent resident status, while some 21 per cent of them did by the end of 2014, according to the [new Statistics Canada report](#).

It was the first study ever that examined Canada's national policies around attracting and retaining temporary foreign workers as immigrants.

Critics say there is nothing in the budget to address backlogs in the refugee and immigration system, though families looking for foreign caregivers can waive the \$1,000 needs assessment fee.

Despite a worsening backlog and surging number of land-border asylum claims via the U.S., the beleaguered Immigration and Refugee Board will not be getting any relief from the Liberal government.

Although the 2017 budget provides \$62.9 million over five years — and \$11.5 million per year thereafter — for legal aid services for asylum claimants, it ignored a recent plea from IRB chair Mario Dion for additional money to deal with its rising backlog of refugee claims, which is expected to hit 30,000 cases this year.

“It is discouraging,” said Janet Dench of the Canadian Council for Refugees. “We are expecting the number of claims to go up dramatically. This is going to hurt everybody.”

The Rural Employment Initiative networks with employers in smaller communities, vets and refers suitable immigrant candidates willing to relocate from Greater Toronto.

March 26, 2017

Apoorvy Kapoor started applying for jobs in Canada even before she arrived from India last May, but none of the 200-plus resumes she sent out to GTA employers yielded a response.

Frustrated with the grim employment prospects, the new immigrant attended a job fair in Mississauga in November put on by the Newcomer Centre of Peel and a staff member asked if she would consider relocating outside of Greater Toronto.

“You go to all these websites and 95 per cent of the job postings are within the GTA,” said Kapoor, who has an undergraduate degree in biomedical engineering and a master’s degree in hospital administration from India. “I just never thought about that.”

Express Entry Improvements: Spring 2017 – To come into effect after June 6, 2017



Additional points for candidates with strong French language skills, with more additional points going to candidates who also have English language skills

March 31, 2017

On June 6, 2017, Express Entry candidates with strong French language skills, with or without English language skills, will be awarded additional points by the CRS.

A total of 15 additional points will be awarded for test results of the Niveaux de compétence linguistique canadiens (NLC) at level 7 in all four language skills in French (listening, speaking, reading and writing) and an English test result of Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) 4 or lower.

A total of 30 additional points will be awarded for test results of the NLC at level 7 in all four skills in French and English test results of CLB 5 or higher.

French-speaking newcomers contribute to the growth, vitality and prosperity of Francophone minority communities across Canada.

Additional points for candidates with siblings in Canada

On June 6, 2017, the Express Entry system will award 15 points to candidates with siblings in Canada.

To get these points, candidates will need to show that the sibling is a Canadian citizen or permanent resident who is living in Canada and is 18 years of age or older.

The sibling in Canada must share a mother or father with the principal Express Entry applicant or their spouse or common-law partner. This relationship can be through blood, marriage, common-law partnership or adoption.

Having a sibling in Canada has been shown to improve health and social outcomes by accelerating a newcomer's integration into their new life in Canada.

Job Bank registration voluntary

On June 6, 2017, Job Bank registration for Express Entry candidates becomes voluntary for all candidates.

Candidates who meet the minimum entry criteria for Express Entry will be automatically placed into the pool and immediately eligible for invitation rounds. If they do not currently have a job in Canada and would like to start their job search, they will be able to register for Job Bank.

Employers will still be able to use all of their existing recruiting methods, including Job Bank, to find Express Entry candidates.

KEY IMMIGRATION MATTERS (FAQs)

Q: What is my client ID?

A: Your client ID, also referred to as a UCI, is on all documents you get from us. It is an **eight or ten-digit number** that looks like this: **0000-0000** or **00-0000-0000**.

If you are applying to us for the first time, you will not yet have a client ID. If you are filling out a form that asks for one, write “Not Applicable” or “N/A” in the space provided.

If you are applying online and the form does not allow you to input “N/A,” leave the space blank.

Q: What is a UCI?

A: UCI stands for “unique client identifier.” It is also known as a client identification number (client ID). It’s on official documents you get from us. It has either:

- four numbers, a hyphen and four more numbers (Example: 0000-0000) or
- two numbers, a hyphen, four numbers, a hyphen and four more numbers (Example: 00-0000-0000)

If you are applying to us for the first time, you will not yet have a UCI. If you are filling out a form that asks for one, write “Not Applicable” or “N/A” in the space provided.

If you are applying online and the form does not allow you to type “N/A,” leave the space blank.

Q: What do you mean by surname?

A: Your surname is your family name. It is also called your “last name.” When filling out applications, type your surname as it appears on your passport, travel or identity document.

Do not use initials.

If you do not have a family name on your passport, travel or identity document, enter all your given name(s) in the surname field and leave the given name field blank. Do not enter “Not applicable,” “*” or “NA.”

Q: If my immigration application is refused, do I have to wait before I apply again?

ISSUE #2, April of 2017

A: If we refuse your application to come to Canada, you can apply again at any time, unless your decision letter says you can't. You should only apply again if you can include information that you didn't include before.

If you had legal status and lost it (for example, if your work permit expired and you did not renew it in time), you have a small amount of time to re-apply. See your decision letter for details.

Q: How long can I stay in Canada as a visitor?

A: A border services officer at the port of entry in Canada will determine how long you can stay in Canada. Most visitors are allowed a six-month stay from the day they entered Canada. If the officer authorizes a stay of less than six months, they will indicate in your passport the date by which you must leave Canada.

If you want to stay longer than your authorized stay, you should apply for an extension at least 30 days before the authorized end of your stay.

Q: I am travelling with my minor child without my spouse. What documents must I present?

You must present the following documents:

- A copy of the child's birth certificate
- A letter of authorization signed by the parent who is not travelling, containing their address and telephone number, in English or French if possible, and
- A photocopy of the non-accompanying parent's signed passport or national identity card

If the parents are separated or divorced, and share custody of the child, the parent travelling with the child should carry copies of the legal custody documents.

If the parents are separated or divorced and one of them has sole custody of the child, the letter of authorization may be signed by that parent only and they should bring a copy of the custody papers.

If one of the child's parents is deceased, the travelling parent should bring a copy of the death certificate.

Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) tool - Skilled immigrants (Express Entry)

The Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) is a point-based system that assesses and scores potential skilled worker candidates on their skills, work experience, language ability, education, and other factors, such as a job offer or a nomination by a province or a territory.
