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The Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program (OINP) has released a list of 15 prioritized occupations for the Human Capital Priorities stream. Candidates with experience in one of the prioritized occupations, which are in the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) sector, do not require a minimum of 400 CRS point to be eligible.

Summary

1. Human Capital Priorities is a stream of the OINP that is aligned with Express Entry.
2. Candidates with experience in prioritized ICT occupations do not need to have 400 CRS points to be eligible.
3. The OINP will continue to issue Notifications of Interest to candidates who meet the stream's eligibility requirements.

Last week, the OINP announced that they would begin issuing targeted Notifications of Interest to candidates who qualify for the Human Capital Priorities stream and who have work experience in one of the specific occupations identified by the OINP.

Human Capital Priorities Stream

The Human Capital Priorities stream is an immigration program run by the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program. It's aligned with Express Entry, so you need to be in the Express Entry pool to be eligible. You can't apply directly to the program. Instead, the OINP searches the pool for Express Entry candidates who meet the stream's eligibility requirements. When they identify an eligible candidate, the OINP issues them a Notification of Interest (NOI). You can only submit an application to the Human Capital Priorities stream after you receive a NOI.

Prioritized Occupations

For these occupations, the OINP has lowered the required minimum Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) score below 400 points.

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Program Status Update - Private Sponsorship for Refugees (PSR) for Syrians and Iraqis

- 1- For all clients whose applications were submitted last year before end of year 2016: application processing has started in June and the Ministry is starting to inquire about these files in an effort to expedite processing to accept and bring refugees to Canada before the end of 2016. This means almost all but few files should have now obtained application/file numbers and these files should be active on IRCC's website (Check Application Status). Once sponsor assessments have been completed for these files, the refugee applications will be sent to the Visa Offices abroad and interviews will be scheduled. It is expected this may take 2-3 months to start happening. In 2017, Canada is still committed to welcoming 25,000 refugees from overseas which includes 16,000 privately sponsored refugees.
- 2- For all prospective clients who haven't applied to the program yet and continue to wait for the program to be reopened: we continue to monitor the situation and discuss with our sponsors and will notify all who have been placed on our waiting list as soon as the program is reopened and allocations have been disbursed to our sponsors. Please ensure you have the required documents and funds ready upon such notification.

1. بالنسبة لكافة عملائنا الذين تم تقديم طلباتهم خلال العام الماضي وقبل نهاية عام 2016، فإن عملية انجاز معاملاتهم ما زالت تتأخر ولمدة أربعة الى ستة شهور لغاية تاريخ يومنا هذا، مما يعني هذا أن عملية الحصول على أرقام المعاملات أو الملفات الخاصة بهم وحجز المواعيد الخاصة بالمقابلات وتفاصيل مرحلة ما بعد اجراء تلك المقابلات بالإضافة الى كافة القرارات النهائية المتعلقة بهذا الامر ما زال هناك تأخير فيها لمدة أربعة الى ستة شهور كما ذكرنا أنفاً، حيث أنه من المتوقع أن التغييرات التي تمت على مستوى مراكز الانجاز التابعة للوزارة خلال شهر ابريل ومايو من هذا العام ستسهم في تسريع انجاز الطلبات الخاصة باللاجئين. وبالرغم من أننا لم نلاحظ حتى الان أية نتائج ايجابية من وراء مثل تلك التغييرات الا أننا ما زلنا نترقب تلك النتائج طالما انه قد تم التأكيد لكفلاننا بأن تلك التحسينات ستثمر قريباً وتنعكس ايجاباً على التعجيل في عملية الانجاز هذه. وفي عام 2017، ما زالت كندا ملتزمة باستقبال 25,000 لاجئ من دول الشرق الاوسط بما في ذلك 16,000 لاجئ يتم كفالته من قبل الجهات الخاصة.

Trudeau touts open Canadian immigration system in face of Trump travel ban - JUNE 27, 2017

Prime minister's news conference wraps up Parliament's spring sitting

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau says he will continue to promote Canada's open immigration policy on the world stage as controversy rages over U.S. President Donald Trump's travel ban.

Trudeau said Tuesday during a news conference in Ottawa to wrap up the parliamentary sitting that government officials have had "multiple conversations" with the U.S. administration about protecting Canadian rights in the face of immigration decisions south of the border.

"But at the same time, Canadians have been very clear that we see immigration as a net positive, that we know we don't have to compromise security to build stronger, more resilient communities," he said. "I will continue to stand for Canadian values and Canadian success in our immigration system as I always have, whether it's in Washington or in Hamburg next week or elsewhere around the world."

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El Salvador woman at the heart of legal challenge to Safe Third Country Agreement - JULY 08, 2017

Test case to determine whether refugees crossing from U.S. should be allowed to stay

When an El Salvador woman and her two children arrived from a Buffalo, N.Y., shelter to the Fort Erie border crossing Wednesday, seeking to make a refugee claim in Canada, a team of lawyers from Toronto's Downtown Legal Services was on high alert. They had U of T law students waiting and watching to report back from the border.

As soon as the woman — identified only as "ABC" in court documents — was denied entry under the Safe Third Country Agreement, the legal team filed a Federal Court challenge to the agreement, which they had been working on for months.

The agreement requires refugees to request protection in the first safe country they arrive in. Refugees crossing from the U.S. at official border crossings are usually denied entry into Canada. That's part of the reason why so many risk sometimes dangerous illegal border

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crossings to make a refugee claim once already in the country — a legal loophole that's permitted.

This is the second legal challenge to the agreement but the first with a person at its core.

"I feel happy and nervous and I am very thankful the lawyers are helping," said ABC through a translator, when CBC News met her in a Toronto home on Thursday. "Canada is more humane than the U.S. In the U.S. it's not safe, and I was worried about being sent back to El Salvador."

Where the water takes us



Canadians “love water, we are drawn to it, but for years we have taken it for granted,” writes Elizabeth Renzetti.

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On Canada Day, as many of us celebrate our connection to water, **Elizabeth Renzetti** remembers the person who warned her about the well running dry.

On a recent spring day, I climbed with my husband and two children down the steep side of a valley in an Ontario provincial park so we could reach the creek at the bottom. The children moaned, you can be sure. Mud, gross. Mosquitoes, blech.

Until we reached the bottom, that is. And there was the mundane magic of a Canadian landscape: a gorgeous, fast-flowing body of water, surrounded by trees and flowers and birds. A group of men sat on rocks in the middle, speaking a language I didn't recognize. A young couple had hauled their infant in its stroller down the trail and dipped the smiling baby into the water, a Canadian baptism. My children stopped complaining. We all sat with our feet in the creek, strangers united by this water.

This is one way to think of Canada: We are strangers united by water. Oceans surround us on three sides, at least a quarter of a million rivers flow in all directions. We swim and boat and fish, hardly thinking about our good fortune, barely acknowledging what Hugh MacLennan wrote about the ridiculous bounty of the landscape so many years ago in his novel *Two Solitudes*: “My God! Is all this ours?”

A better question today might be: “My God! Do we even deserve this?” We love water, we are drawn to it, but for years we have taken it for granted. Perhaps we're not quite the guardians we hoped we'd be. We may be on the verge of paying the price.

Edward Snowden's 'guardian angels' seek fast-track refugee claim to Canada, **JULY 17, 2017**

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OTTAWA—A group of Hong Kong asylum seekers who sheltered the American surveillance whistleblower [Edward Snowden](#) in 2013 is calling on the Canadian government to speed up their refugee applications in the face of concern they will be imminently detained, deported and separated from their children.

The group's legal team, which consists of lawyers in Hong Kong and Montreal, accused Canadian officials of reversing a decision in April to expedite the refugee applications of the so-called "Snowden's Guardian Angels." They told reporters on Parliament Hill the asylum seekers would face possible arrest, torture or death if they are deported to their home countries of Sri Lanka and the Philippines, and are demanding an explanation from Ottawa about why the cases aren't being fast-tracked.

The lawyers plan to submit a motion in Federal Court on Tuesday to force the government to hear their cases as soon as possible.

"It's unacceptable, and it's immoral," said Marc-André Séguin, one of the lawyers representing the four adults and three young children hoping to come to Canada. He suggested the Justin Trudeau government, which has branded the country as a haven for refugees, is at risk of contradicting its own welcoming rhetoric.

Human Rights Watch has also called on the government to fast-track the applications.

"We invite (Trudeau) to review his messages, to look at the photos of these three children," Séguin said, "and to ask himself the question: do these people deserve a future?"

Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Minister Ahmed Hussen, whose department handles such applications, was not available for an interview Monday, according to his office.

In an emailed statement, Hussen's spokesperson Hursh Jaswal said the minister has not made any promise to expedite the Hong Kong claimants' applications. He said the government is committed to making sure every case is "evaluated based on its merits and in a fair manner," but declined to comment further because of "privacy laws."

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Forgotten refugees' say they're tired of waiting for their cases to be heard -

July 06, 2017

There are about 5,500 so-called “legacy” asylum claims waiting to be heard.

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Some came to Canada for asylum as children and are now finishing high school. Others arrived as young adults and are now parents. Many have not seen their families back home for five or six years.

On Thursday, these “forgotten refugees” who have been waiting for an asylum hearing since 2012, held a silent protest in front of the Immigration and Refugee Board headquarters in Toronto, hoping to be heard by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau’s government.

It took courage for them to come forward, as many still have loved ones back home facing persecution while others fear repercussions by Canadian officials and the public for demanding rights and justice, said protest organizer David Mateo Camelo, a refugee claimant from Colombia.

“We are tired of waiting. We are tired of not being heard,” said the 21-year-old, who came here with his parents, sister and nephew in September 2012 after his father, a provincial politician, was allegedly targeted by guerrillas associated with the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia, also known as FARC. “We have faces. We are not just papers.”

There are about 5,500 so-called “legacy” asylum claims waiting to be heard. These are claims filed before Dec. 15, 2012, when the former Conservative government overhauled the asylum system by introducing statutory timelines to hear new claims and expedite removals of failed claimants — leaving the old cases on the back burner.

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Notice – Canada imposes a visa requirement on Antigua and Barbuda

Ottawa, June 26, 2017— As of 5:30 a.m. EDT June 27, 2017, citizens from Antigua and Barbuda will need a visa to travel to Canada. At that time, any existing electronic travel authorization (eTA) issued to a citizen of Antigua and Barbuda will no longer be valid, and these travellers will not be able to use their (eTA) to travel to Canada.

After carefully monitoring the integrity of Antigua and Barbuda's travel documents, the Government of Canada has determined that Antigua and Barbuda no longer meets Canada's criteria for a visa exemption.

Canada continues to welcome visitors from Antigua and Barbuda, while protecting the integrity of our immigration system and ensuring the safety of Canadians. Most approved visa applicants will receive a multiple-entry visa, which allows travellers to visit Canada as many times as they want, for up to 10 years. For each visit, travellers can stay for up to six months.

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Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: What are skilled workers and why do we need them?

A: Skilled workers are selected for their ability to contribute to our economy and establish themselves successfully in Canada. They are the most skilled and highly educated immigrants that Canada accepts. Research shows that the demand for qualified workers in Canada is growing. Two-thirds of the available jobs will require post-secondary education. Jobs that require a university-level education are the fastest growing types of jobs. Skilled workers do well in Canada. With their generic skill set, they are better able to weather downturns in the economy. They are also more successful in the labour market than other immigrants, catching up to their Canadian counterparts more quickly and earning the highest average incomes.

Q: Why doesn't the government simply increase resources for processing and accept more immigrants?

A: Investing more money in processing without addressing the underlying structural problem with the current legislation will not allow us to tackle the backlog and make the system more flexible. We also need to ensure that we manage immigration in the country's interest. Like most countries, Canada manages the number of immigrants we accept every year. We do so to balance the number of immigrants we welcome with the opportunities and infrastructure available to help them successfully integrate and settle into Canadian communities and the work force. The legislative amendments, combined with the 2008 budget funding, are necessary to better manage applications, to be more responsive to the labour market, and to allow the Department to begin to reduce the backlog of applications.

Q: I have read in media reports that the Minister will have the power to deny admission to someone who has been approved by an officer. Is this true?

A: No. The bill would give the Minister the authority to issue instructions to officers on the categories and the number of applications to process. However, it would not give the Minister the authority to reject an application that has been processed and accepted. As is currently the case, the decisions on individual applications would be made by CIC immigration officers. The Minister cannot reverse these decisions. The instructions provided by the Minister will be open and transparent. They will be published in the Canada Gazette, reported in the Department's annual report to Parliament and posted on the CIC website. The instructions must be consistent with the overall objectives of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, which are to support Canada's economy and competitiveness, reunite families and provide protection to those who need it. They would also be consistent with the Canadian Charter

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of Rights and Freedoms, which protects against discrimination on such bases as race, national or ethnic origin, colour, religion, sex, age, and mental or physical disability.

Q: Why are some applications processed the same day while others take years?

A: Canada remains a destination of choice. Processing all the applications the country receives, including conducting proper medical and security checks, does take time. Temporary resident visa applications—visitors, workers and students—are processed upon receipt. Processing times may vary depending on medical, criminal and other screening requirements. Generally, temporary foreign workers are among those given priority since they have job offers and fill a specific labour market need that Canadian workers are unavailable to satisfy. Priority is also given to certain immigrant classes, and this can mean longer processing times for others. For example, our aim is to give priority to applications for sponsored spouses. Eighty percent of these cases are finalized within eight months. Immigrants selected under the Canada-Quebec Accord or provincial nominee agreements are given priority processing over other economic immigrants, such as federal skilled workers. In addition, our humanitarian traditions require that applications from people in need of protection be processed quickly.

Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) tool - Skilled immigrants (Express Entry)



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The Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) is a point-based system that assesses and scores potential skilled worker candidates on their skills, work experience, language ability, education, and other factors, such as a job offer or a nomination by a province or a territory.

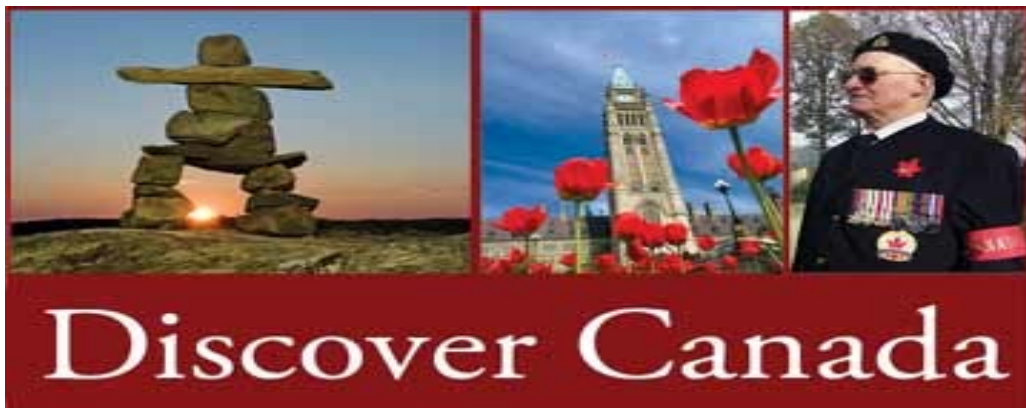
