MAIN ARTICLE

Citizenship Bill Receives Royal Assent—

June 19, 2017 – Ottawa, ON – Today, **Bill C-6**, an Act to amend the Citizenship Act and make consequential amendments to another Act, received Royal Assent.

Changes to the Citizenship Act reflect the Government's commitments to streamline the citizenship process, enhance program integrity, and repeal certain provisions of the Act that treated dual citizens differently than other Canadians. Some changes to the Citizenship Act take effect immediately upon Royal Assent, while others take effect at later dates to ensure the necessary regulatory changes and departmental preparations are in place for a smooth transition for applicants.

As of today, applicants are no longer required to intend to continue to live in Canada once granted citizenship, providing more flexibility to Canadians who may need to live outside of Canada for work or personal reasons.

Immediate changes also include repealing the ability to revoke citizenship from dual citizens convicted of crimes against the national interest. Dual citizens living in Canada who are convicted of these crimes will face the Canadian justice system, like other Canadian citizens who break the law.

Some of the changes that are expected to take effect later this fall will give more flexibility to both younger and older eligible immigrants to obtain citizenship. These changes include reducing the time permanent residents must be physically present in Canada to three out of five years, instead of four out of six years, before applying for citizenship; amending the age range for people to meet the language and knowledge requirements for citizenship from 14-64 years to 18-54 years; and counting some of the time applicants spend in Canada as temporary residents or protected persons toward their physical presence requirements for citizenship.

Other changes that are expected to take effect next year include strengthening the citizenship revocation process by having the Federal Court as the decision-maker on most cases, thereby enhancing the procedural fairness of the process. Program Status Update - Private Sponsorship for Refugees (PSR) for Syrians and Iraqis

1. For all clients whose applications were submitted last year before end of year 2016: application processing continues to be delayed by at least 4-6 months to date. This means obtaining application/file numbers, interviews, post-interview processing and final decisions are all being delayed by the six months mentioned above. Changes in Ministry processing centers have been made in April and May to get back on track and to expedite application processing for refugee applications. Even though we haven't seen results from such changes yet, we as long as our sponsors have been assured that improvements are coming and we continue to anticipate them.
2. For most clients whose applications were submitted last year and only received their file/application numbers in late 2016 or early 2017: some of the received application numbers "Gxxxxxxx" referencing these submitted applications haven't yet been activated on the IRCC web form for most applications. This is also being impacted by the overall general delay faced

by the Ministry and Ministry staff. Please continue to check and rest assured that this doesn't impact your application processing as that is a separate process from updating your application information and status online.

3. For all prospective clients who haven't applied to the program yet and continue to wait for the program to be reopened: we continue to monitor the situation and discuss with our sponsors and will notify all who have been placed on our waiting list as soon as the program is reopened and allocations have been disbursed to our sponsors. Please ensure you have the required documents and funds ready upon such notification.

1. بالنسبة لكافة عملائنا الذين تم تقديم طلباتهم خلال العام الماضي وقبل نهاية عام 2016، فان عملية انجاز معاملاتهم ما زالت تتأخر ولمدة أربعة الى ستة شهور لغاية تاريخ يومنا هذا، مما يعني هذا أن عملية الحصول على أرقام المعاملات أو الملفات الخاصة بهم وحجز المواعيد الخاصة بالمقابلات وتفصيل مرحلة ما بعد اجراء تلك المقابلات بالإضافة الى كافة القرارات النهائية المتعلقة بهذا الامر ما زال هناك تأخير فيها لمدة أربعة الى ستة شهور كما ذكرنا أنفاً، حيث أنه من المتوقع أن التغييرات التي تمت على مستوى مراكز الانجاز التابعة للوزارة خلال شهر ابريل ومايو من هذا العام ستسهم في تسريع انجاز الطلبات الخاصة باللاجئين. وبالرغم من أننا لم نلاحظ حتى الان أية نتائج ايجابية من وراء مثل تلك التغييرات الا أننا ما زلنا نترقب تلك النتائج طالما انه قد تم التأكيد لكفلاننا بأن تلك التحسينات ستثمر قريباً وتنعكس ايجاباً على التعجيل في عملية الانجاز هذه.
2. وبالنسبة لمعظم عملائنا الذين تم تقديم طلباتهم خلال العام الماضي وقاموا باستلام أرقام ملفاتهم أو طلباتهم في أواخر عام 2016 أو مطلع عام 2017، فانه لم يتم تفعيل حتى الان الارقام المرجعية لبعض الطلبات التي تم تقديمها مسبقاً على النماذج الالكترونية المستخدمة من قبل وزارة الهجرة الكندية، كما أن التأخير الذي تواجهه الوزارة وموظفوها فيما يخص هذا الامر يشكل عام من شأنه التأثير سلباً على ذلك. وعليه، يرجى مواصلة المتابعة ونود طمأننتكم بأن هذا الأمر لن يؤثر على عملية انجاز معاملتكم لان ذلك يمثل عملية مستقلة ومختلفة عن التحديث الالكتروني الخاص بالمعلومات المتعلقة بطلباتكم أو وضعها.

Why refugees are heading north

A month ago, U.S. President Donald Trump's executive order on immigration closed the door on visitors from seven Muslim-majority countries: Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria and Yemen. The courts eventually put that order on hold, but Mr. Trump issued a second one that removed Iraq from the list. Meanwhile, U.S. law-enforcement agencies have ramped up measures to deport

unauthorized immigrants, and Mr. Trump says the U.S. will move ahead with his election campaign promise to build a wall along the Mexican border.

A rising number of asylum seekers in the U.S. are turning to Canada instead, crossing the border in remote fields and forests and risking frostbite in the winter cold. Several of the travellers The Globe has spoken with say Mr. Trump's policies are the reason they made the trip:

As Ahmed Hussen walked the grounds of some of the world's largest Syrian refugee camps last month, everything came full circle. Welcomed into the makeshift homes of residents, he spoke to them not only as Canada's Immigration Minister, but as a former refugee who had once been in their shoes, forced out of his home with nowhere to go.

Mr. Hussen made his first trip as minister to the Middle East from May 17 to 27 – it was not publicized for security reasons – and visited two of Jordan’s largest refugee camps: Zaatari and Azraq. He said he had an instant connection with the refugees he met, having been through a similar experience when he fled Somalia’s civil war with his family in the early 1990s and spent days completely exposed in the East African wilderness.

The government is facing pressure from MPs of all political stripes to crack down on bogus immigration consultants who prey on people who are desperate to work or live in Canada.

The Commons immigration committee has just wrapped up weeks of hearings on unregistered representatives called "ghost consultants." MPs are now considering recommendations ranging from overhauling or even scrapping the independent oversight body, to imposing heavier penalties for perpetrators.

Members heard harrowing stories from duped clients who testified behind closed doors. Some were ripped off for thousands of dollars, or brought over with the promise of work only to be dumped at the side of the road or left in a warehouse. In all, they heard from 50 witnesses and read 24 written submissions.

Liberal MP and committee chair Borys Wrzesnewskij said testimony about crooked and ghost consultants made it clear the status quo can't continue.

Immigration minister announces changes to the Express Entry Program - JUNE 05, 2017

The federal government has made some changes to the express entry immigration program, awarding more points to applicants who have siblings in Canada and those who have strong French language skills.

Immigration Minister Ahmed Hussen announced the changes Monday morning at a centre for immigrants in Markham, Ont., just north of Toronto.

Under the express entry program, applicants can score a total of 1,200 points depending on their education, training, work experience and language skills. The program was launched by the previous Conservative government as a way of fast-tracking permanent residency for highly skilled foreigners.

Starting on Tuesday, the express entry system will begin awarding 15 points to candidates who have siblings in Canada. The sibling must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident aged 18 or older.

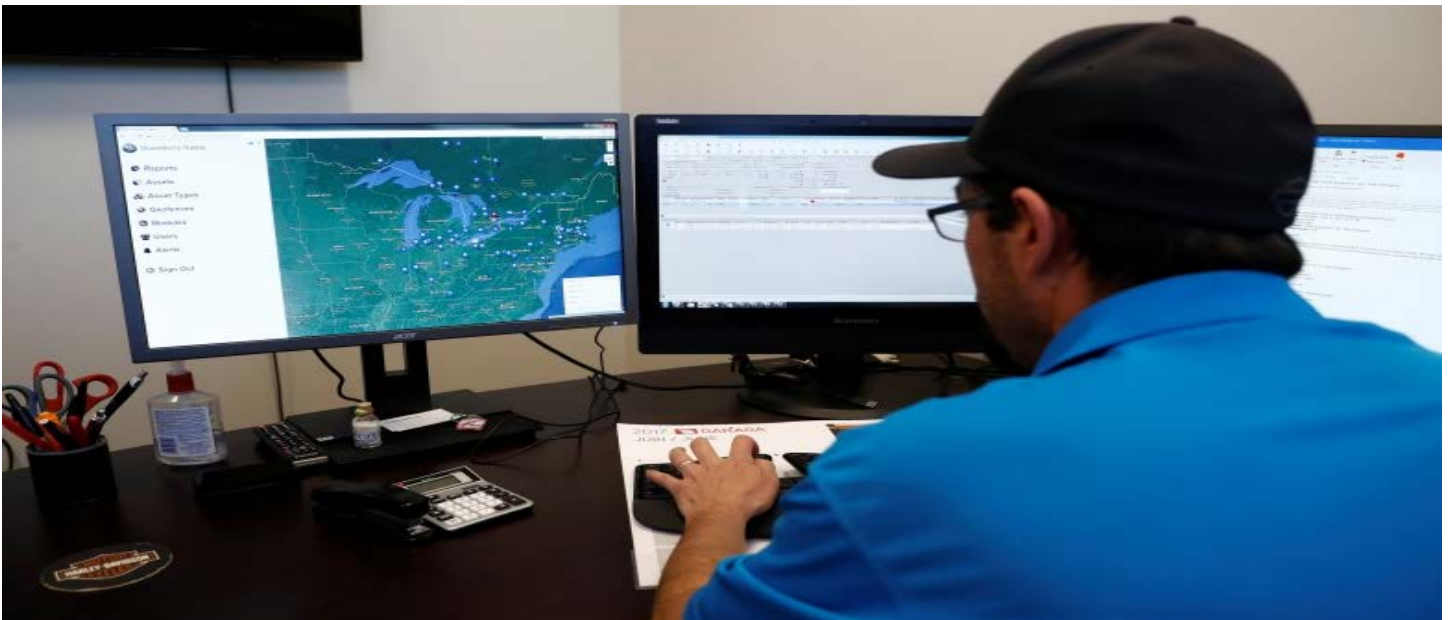
“Studies have shown that as newcomers build a new life in Canada, those with siblings benefit by having improved integration into Canadian society,” Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada said in an update on its website.

Previously, no points were awarded to applicants with siblings in Canada.

The program will also start awarding up to 30 additional points to candidates with strong French-language skills, depending on their language test results. The additional points can be awarded regardless of whether the candidate also has English language skills.

A federal government initiative promises to make it easier and faster for companies to bring high-skilled, temporary workers to Canada, but one expert on innovation policy says the measure doesn't provide the long-term recruitment solutions Canadian businesses need.

The Global Talent Stream, part of the Temporary Foreign Worker Program, is available to employers who meet one of two criteria.

Employers that can demonstrate a need for foreign workers with specific skills in order to grow their business can be referred to the program by designated partner organizations of Employment and Social Development Canada.

The Global Talent Stream program is also open to companies that need skilled foreign workers with specific in-demand skills, as determined by [ESDC's Global Talent Occupations List](#). The list includes high-tech occupations such as software engineers, web developers and digital media designers.

The popular Quebec Immigrant Investor Program (QIIP) has reopened for up to 1,900 new applications, as of May 29, 2017. The QIIP is Canada's only currently available passive investor

immigration program, and throughout the years it has proven popular — the intake is expected to fill before the scheduled end date of the application cycle, February 23, 2018.

Following the entry into effect of the Regulation respecting quotas of brokers and trust companies (PDF, 42 Kb) on July 15, 2015, financial intermediaries must have been allocated a number of agreements (quota) in order to sign an investment agreement with a foreign national who is submitting an application for a selection certificate.

To be eligible for this program, you must:

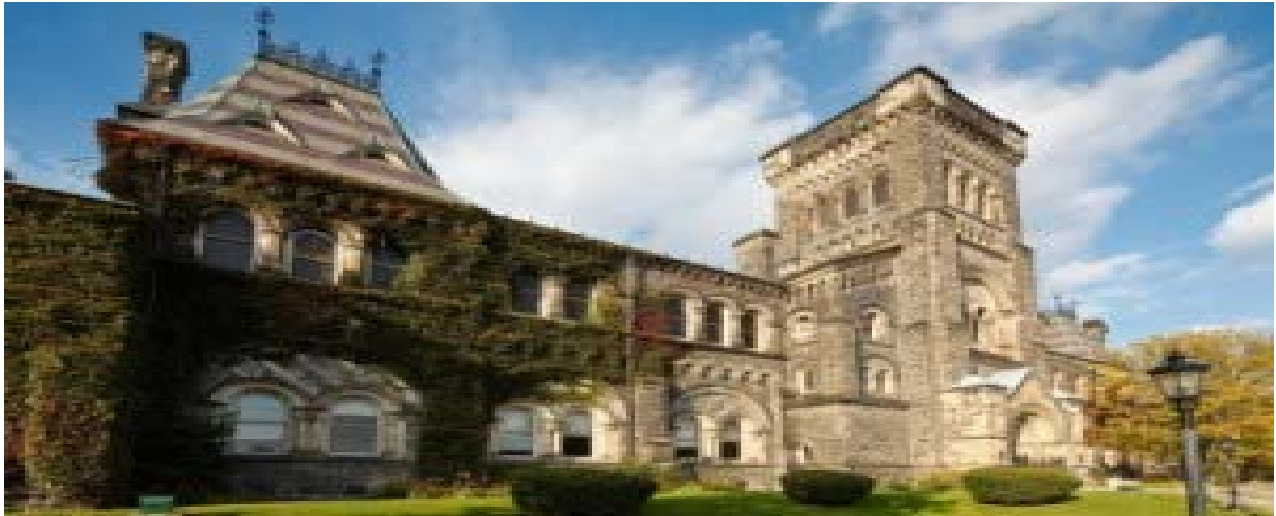
- Have, alone or with his accompanying spouse, including de facto spouse, net assets of at least \$1,600,000 CAN obtained legally, excluding the amounts received by donation less than six months before the date on which the application was filed;
- Have experience in management in a legal farming, commercial or industrial business, or in a legal professional business where the staff, excluding the investor, occupies at least the equivalent of two full-time jobs, or for an international agency or a government or one of its departments or agencies;
- We define management experience as the exercise, for at least two years in the five years preceding the application for a selection certificate, of duties related to the planning, management and control of financial resources and of human or material resources under your authority; the experience does not include experience acquired in the context of an apprenticeship, training or specialization process attested to by a diploma.
- Intend to settle in Québec and sign an agreement to invest \$800,000 CAN with a financial intermediary (broker or trust company) authorized to participate in the Investor Program.

Ontario's International Masters and PhD Graduate Streams are a Popular Pathway to Permanent Residence - MAY 02, 2017



On May 1, 2017, the province of Ontario reopened the International Masters Graduate and International PhD Graduate streams of the Ontario Immigrant Nominee Program (OINP) for the second time in 2017. In a testament to the popularity of these streams, the International Masters Graduate stream reached its intake limit that same day. These popular Canadian immigration streams offer a route to permanent residence for eligible individuals who have studied in Ontario.

The International PhD Graduate stream remains open as of May 2, but it may be expected that this stream also will reach its intake limit in coming days — as was the case the last time both streams opened, in late February, 2017. The government of Ontario had previously stated that it intends to open and close these two streams intermittently throughout 2017, in order to better handle demand and fulfil the federal nomination allocation for the province in 2017. Consequently, it may be expected that potential International Masters Graduate stream candidates may have another chance to submit an application in coming months. The nature of these two streams, which can both open and close with little warning, proves that proactive candidates who prepare in advance are in the best position to submit an application when the time comes.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: What are the requirements for becoming a Canadian citizen?

A: Your eligibility for citizenship depends on your situation, such as:

- adult (18 years of age or older) permanent residents of Canada applying for:
 - yourself
 - your minor (under 18) child
- past Canadian citizens who want to get your Canadian citizenship back
 - this includes current and former Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) members
- Canadians applying for citizenship for your adopted child born outside Canada
- current or former CAF members applying under the fast-track process

Q: Do I become a Canadian citizen when I marry a Canadian?

A: No. Marrying a Canadian citizen doesn't give you citizenship.

If you want to become a Canadian citizen, you must follow the same steps as everyone else. There isn't a special process for spouses of Canadian citizens.

You must meet several requirements to apply for citizenship. This includes being physically present in Canada as a permanent resident for at least:

- 1,460 days during the six years right before the date you applied
- 183 days during each of four calendar years that are fully or partially within the six years right before the date you applied

Your Canadian spouse can sponsor you to become a permanent resident if you:

- don't live in Canada or

- aren't a permanent resident

You may apply for citizenship if you:

- are a permanent resident
- have lived in Canada long enough
- meet the other requirements

Q: I need to leave Canada and I do not have a permanent resident card. Can I later return to Canada without a PR card?

A: Canada's entry requirements are changing

Permanent residents (PR) of Canada must carry and present their valid PR card or permanent resident travel document (PRTD) when boarding a flight to Canada, or travelling to Canada on any other commercial carrier. If you do not carry your PR card or PRTD, you may not be able to board your flight, train, bus or boat to Canada.

It is your responsibility to ensure that your PR card is still valid when you return from travel outside Canada, and to apply for a new PR card when your current card expires.

How can I extend my stay as a visitor?

A: If you want to extend your stay in Canada, you should apply at least 30 days before your status expires.

For the steps to apply, see [How to apply to extend your stay as a visitor](#). You can also apply online.

Temporary residents currently in Canada with a valid study or work permit must submit their application for a new temporary resident visa to the Case Processing Centre in Ottawa (CPC-O), or visa office that serves their country of nationality.

- If your temporary resident status expires after you have submitted your application for an extension but before you receive a decision on your application, you can stay in Canada under what's called implied status. That means the law implies you are a temporary resident. That status lasts until Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) decides on your new permit application.
- If you have a single-entry visa this allows you to enter Canada once. If you leave Canada during your authorized stay, you must get a new visitor visa to re-enter Canada, unless you visit the United States or St. Pierre and Miquelon. If you visit those places, you can return to Canada without a new visa, as long as you:

- o return within the period that the Canadian immigration officer initially authorized when you first entered Canada (on your visa, it is either a handwritten date or 6 months from the date of the entry stamp); or
- o have a valid visitor record, work permit, study permit or temporary resident permit (authorizing re-entry), and return within the period that the officer initially authorized.

Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) tool - Skilled immigrants (Express Entry)



The Comprehensive Ranking System (CRS) is a point-based system that assesses and scores potential skilled worker candidates on their skills, work experience, language ability, education, and other factors, such as a job offer or a nomination by a province or a territory.

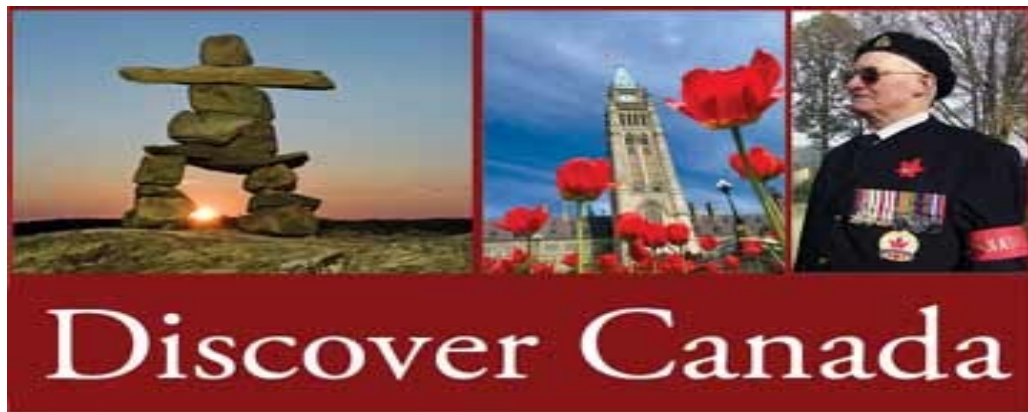
